



Optimism for the Future of Twmbarlwm

FROMTHE FIRST DAY that the Twmbarlwm Society was formed our motto has been "Dedicated to Research. and Restore Protect Mvnvdd Twmbarlwm" and here nearly 10 years on, that sentiment is as relevant as ever - and we are hopeful to push forward with that mantra even more this coming year.

Five years ago the Society took part in a survey (along with other local societies) that had been commissioned by Torfaen and Caerphilly County councils to help identify ways in which the area could be developed in the future.

Since the publication of that survey, known as the 'Twmbarlwm and Mynydd Maen Scoping Study', funding has been put in place and CTS are now hopeful that some of the proposals we put forward to the survey will be implemented over the next few years.

The overall project is referred to as 'The Adventure Triangle', it takes in the mountain ridge running from the A467 Hafodyrynys - Pontypool road to Twmbarwlm and along the Monmouthshire Brecon Canal.

Proposals in this project include the development of 'physical links and key connections between Cwmcarn over Mynydd Maen and Twmbarlwm' to Torfaen.

To put it simply the idea is to encourage more people to make use of the mountain ridge for recreation by linking the common and Twmbarwlm to the Cwmcarn Visitor Centre and Forest Drive and to Blaen Bran in Cwmbran. There will be improved signage and track repairs done to aid cross-common cycling, horse riding and walking routes to link Blaen Bran and Cwmcarn.

As far as the Society is concerned, we are now more optimistic that some plans that we have had in place for years will now come to fruition. Indeed some projects have already been put in place.

Projects include everything from landscape repair and erecting new signs to addressing illegal off-roading and anti-social behaviour. To help achieve these aims we will be calling for a great deal of volunteer help in the months ahead. So please watch this space for further information and regularly check out our website and Facebook page. If you are interested in volunteering, come along and meet us - there's plenty of opportunity to do so at the other events we hold. For instance, just around the corner it's the annual tradition of tramping up to

> Twmbarlwm on Good Friday (April 19th) - what we now call our Hot-Cross-Bun Walk. Again this year there will be organised walks from the Stony Bridge in Pontymister, Cwmcarn Visitor Centre and Cwmbran.

We also have a couple of our popular historical talks planned. There will be a talk at Crosskeys RFC on the History of Newport Castle (TBC) and later in March there will be a fascinating talk on the famous Bowmen of Gwent and the part they played at the Battle of Agincourt.

There are also walks planned - one around the Forest Drive, one to Pwll Tra and another to Llanderfel Chapel. Each of these walks is always very popular so please keep an eve on our website for announcements.

Many members come along to these events, it's always a good time to catch up with news of what the society is up to, and with all the work we anticipate in the future we need all the help we can get.

The Big

HAIVIER of Rogerstone

(The de Havilland Forge)

The Northern Aluminium Co, Rogerstone, became a major producer for the Second World War effort and as such the site was a prime target for German warplanes but was never hit. Lord Haw Haw (the traitor William Joyce) often interrupted BBC radio (no TV's about in those days) warning that tonight's target was the Aluminium factory in Rogerstone. Although Aluminium parts were fabricated for many aircraft sections, the main target for the German air force was the de Havilland section of the factory. A factory within a factory. Housed in this factory was the de Havilland Forge which produced more aircraft propeller blades than anywhere else in the UK.

An approximate description of the process was that one half of the mould was placed on the bottom of the forge (the anvil) and the other half on the hammer section of the forge. A heated section of aluminium ingot was placed on the anvil and then the hammer came down with force and forged the propeller blades. These were then trimmed ready for despatch. The hammer descended with a force of 2,000 tons and considerable noise which was a feature of the Ty-Du area of Rogerstone (or in Welsh, the Ty-Du area of Tregwilym the original welsh

of the Ty-Du area of Rogerstone (or in Welsh, the Ty-Du area of Tregwilym, the original welsh speakers' name for Rogerstone). There are still people living today who can remember the noise of the hammer and even claims that vibration could be felt near St. Johns Church.

The Location of the Forge today on the Jubilee Park estate would be between De Haia Road and the River.



Towards the end of 1940 (just after the Battle of Britain) The de Havilland Co. had the feeling that there would develop a very serious shortage of aircraft propeller blade forgings. After repeatedly pressing these views with the authorities, and because of the growing seriousness of the position, the company made an offer to start a forge of their own using their own capital. A scheme to construct their own forge at Rogerstone, near Newport, Monmouthshire, was proposed on 28th Feb 1941. Approval was secured in July 18th 1941 and site work began in August.

The output was originally planned to reach 1000 forgings per month but the company's early anxieties were confirmed for, before the forge got going the Ministry asked for the programme to be expanded and offered capital assistance to this end. The project was increased by stages to 1,250 forgings per month. The first completed forging was delivered in Jan 1942 and from then until VJ day (Victory over Japan) a total of 67.178 forgings had left the works. With some smaller forgings the total output was 2,987 tons. For most of the time a three shift operation was in operation and the total number of employees reached 497. Later with increased efficiency and one shift with only 300 employees working, peak output reached 5,531 blades per month. This figure exceeds by a considerable margin the highest number of blade forgings ever produced in a one month period by any other supplier in the country. It represents an increase of 70% over the output that the DH Forge was planned to provide. This greatly helped the de Havilland propeller production through two and a half very busy years.



Twins play a significant role in popular culture, from identical pairings like Tweedledee and Tweedledum to mismatched siblings in the form of Arnold Schwarzenegger and Danny DeVito in...er... Twins. For my part, I am an only child but my aunt swears she saw my doppelgänger at a local pub. But then, surely all pubs serve doubles!

Of course, it's not just people who might have twins. The idea of twinning towns to bring disparate communities together in a fractured post-war Europe goes back as far as the late '40s. The concept quickly gained popularity and nowadays, you might be hard pressed to find somewhere not linked to a distant counterpart. Newport is no exception and in fact, it is somewhat spoilt because rather than having just one twin, it has three.

The oldest union is with Heidenheim in southern

Germany. The relationship was officially cemented in 1981 and both places have remained close ever since. The link fostered between the Newport Philharmonic Choir and the Heidenheim Oratorienchor has proven particularly strong and to mark noteworthy anniversaries, they have exchanged gifts, such as bespoke pottery, embroidery, and a specially-commissioned love spoon. In recognition of the civic partnership, the road leading from the Harlequin Roundabout to Kingsway is called Heidenheim Drive. Likewise. Heidenheim has



Newporter Strasse, a small street which has an English language school at one end and the River Brenz at the other. Famously, Field Marshal Rommel, known as The Desert Fox during World War II, was born in the town. Another of Newport's twins is Kutaisi: the third largest city in Georgia, the home of the Georgian Parliament until last vear, and most importantly, the birthplace of the singer, Katie Melua. A formal application for twinning Newport with a Soviet town was submitted to Moscow shortly after its success with Heidenheim. Many years passed without apparent progress but unbeknownst to the council here, Kutaisi was looking to pair up with a British municipality. Despite there being a number of willing possibilities in England. the authorities settled on Newport in 1989. The choice was perhaps made because of perceived similarities between Georgia and Wales: both are

mountainous countries of comparable size with their own language and culture, as well as a shared passion for rugby. At the start of the millennium. Kutaisi renamed one of its main thoroughfares, Newport Street, in honour of the association. Meanwhile, the pathway alongside the Usk between Newport Bridge and the new footbridge was christened Kutaisi Walk in 2010. Admittedly, this would not appear to be on quite the same scale but it's the thought that counts and at least there's a commemorative plaque. The final member of our trio is doubtless the most controversial: Wuzhou in the Chinese Province of Guangxi was twinned with Newport in 1986. Despite this, contact has been comparatively infrequent. The last major interaction seems to have been in 2004 when a delegation from China visited the National Eisteddfod at Tredegar House. In the past year, however, local



campaigners have urged the cutting of ties in view of the Yulin Dog Festival. Established in 2009, the Province plays host to the annual ten day event at which around 10,000 of man's best friend are consumed. Activists believe many are killed inhumanely and there are claims that pets are stolen specifically to be served up to hungry festival-

goers. Definitely not the sort of dog show we are used to over here. A petition demanding that Newport terminates the connection with its twin has gained thousands of signatures and whilst it is often said you can't choose your family, our city is in the fortunate position that it most certainly can.

Oxford House Industrial History Society

After a few years in the increasingly crowded Oxford House complex, in 1974 the society was offered an empty classroom in the old **Pontymister Secondary** School for their Friday evening lectures. This extended to being given the use of an outside building, previously the pottery room. as the first Museum enabling various bits & pieces to be transferred from the garden of Oxford House. This was officially opened by Winford Vaughan Thomas with Saturday mornings becoming the regular opening time. Although suffering an influx of two feet of water during the 1978 Risca flood (the building was next to the river wall) most of the contents survived intact.

The Chemist Shop contents which had been saved from a skip in Cardiff were enabled to be put together in another empty classroom in such a way as to recreate, as closely as possible, it's original look. This was also opened on Saturday mornings.

An old railway wagon was placed in the school yard and used for storage. There was much mindless vandalism at this time and the Society were aware of the two remaining gravestones in the Miners Cemetery at Greenmeadow. These were of great historical importance but very vulnerable,







so a few Society members took the decision to rescue them and store them in the railway wagon. They are now incorporated into the memorial wall at the back of the cemetery.

There followed a very settled period of time at Pontymister which ended in 1990 when we were informed that the school buildings were to be demolished, Lidl and it's car park now occupy the site. The Society returned to Oxford House for their Friday evening lectures but what about the Museum and Chemist Shop. Islwyn Borough Council offered free storage in an empty industrial unit in Pontllanfraith but the Society had to arrange transportation and do the physical moving. Over three years later the

council acquired the old Risca Miners Institute using European Heritage funding by allowing the Industrial History Society to install the museum on the ground floor and using it for their weekly lectures whilst the upper floor was converted for use by other Oxford House groups. This has been the Societies home since then. The Oxford House Industrial History Society meets on the ground floor of the old Risca Miners Institute (Risca Museum) in Grove Road at 7pm on a Friday evening. The new season started on January 4th and future illustrated talks includes the Llanerch Colliery disaster, Neath Abbey Ironworks and the History of Risca Type. 



Sugarloaf Mountain



I was thinking of maybe a stroll along the canal or a quick trip to the Heritage Coast for a meander along the beach, followed by a nice cup of coffee somewhere. I don't quite know how it happened but I was persuaded that it would be a good idea to tackle Sugarloaf Mountain again. We've had a working relationship with the man-made lake at Cyfarthfa Castle, Merthyr Tydfil for a number of years. This is one which has been a source of moderate to considerable difficulty from the beginning. On the plus side there is Mary who lives locally; she is totally committed to the welfare of the birds which have made the lake their home, and so far, there appears to be no limit to the lengths to which she will go to assist any bird which is in distress; at this location, the majority of problems are angling related. Based on our experience, and therefore just our opinion, the extent of commitment to solving problems here on the part of the local authority is minimal. Be that as it may...

n our opinion, this lake with, at its simplest, its two small islands and vertical masonry sides is far from ideal as a habitat for swans. Nevertheless, a few years ago a breeding pair arrived, and a succession of families of cygnets was produced. The normal procedure is that, at the end of the breeding season, late summer and extending quite possibly into the early weeks of the following year, the cygnets

leave. They do so, either of their own accord, or the adult male (cob) 'encourages' them to move out. Failure to leave tends to have catastrophic consequences, in short, death by drowning.

At the end of the 2017 season.

At the end of the 2017 season, 'normal procedure' was not followed. Three of the cygnets did not leave, and although it was clear all three were capable of flight, the cob's efforts to force them out were somewhat

half hearted. And so, most unusually the pair of swans, in 2018, produced a further six cygnets, bringing the total swan population at Cyfarthfa to 11. Summer waned into autumn. and we suffered the expected number of incidents involving fishing tackle entanglements. We know of only one early attempt to leave the lake by one of these, on 24th September, and this ended very badly less than a mile from the lake. We were unable to reach Merthyr in time to save him.

The next episode in this story occurred on 25th November. Mary, remarked that all the swans were missing apart from one of the 2018 cygnets; every indication was that he was unable to fly. The problem

seemed to be associated with the wing joints, which in a human, would have been its elbows. There appeared to be some form of constraint preventing the wings from stretching to their full extent. We picked up this bird on 30th November, and transferred it to the Swan Sanctuary (Shepperton) about a week later. Now there were no swans at Cyfarthfa.

This is the way it remained right until the end of the year, when all the others, three generations, returned, plus one other swan! No reports were received to indicate where they had been. This 'extra' individual now faced two problems: (i), when it came to feeding he was clearly unwelcome, the adult male made it his business to 'see him off', and (ii), there was a large lump on the left side of the

face a short distance below the eye, one effect of which appeared to actually impede the ability of the bird to feed. This bird was caught, not without some difficulty, on 1st January and transferred to Shepperton on 3rd where an x-ray examination revealed a 5mm diameter ball bearing, clearly, there are some dreadful people

about. This was removed surgically and the bird is now doing well.

Finally, for the time being at



least, it came to our notice four cvanets had gone missing from Cyfarthfa. They had actually been moved to Parc Taf Bargoed, so on the 10th we went up to investigate. Moving swans just because it seems like a good idea at the time, e.g. 'to reduce the possibility of overcrowding' is seldom a good thing, and in any case is illegal under the provisions of the 1982 Wildlife and Countryside Act. If there really is a desperate need for a move, which more often than not has to be proved. then a licence has to be obtained through the Welsh Assembly Government. From our own experience, such a licence is not granted readily. Quite apart from anything else the selection of a site for release of the 'refugees' is not

easily resolved. How things will turn out in the long run is not easy to gauge. There is one resident adult male swan there. He is disabled to a degree: he is not able to sustain flight. Having observed the behaviour of the swans over a period of about two hours during our visit, we are confident the cygnets comprise of three males and one female. The latter spent a great deal of time in close company with the adult, that is, when he wasn't giving the other three a hard time. Of particular concern is the precipitous nature of the outfall from the lake into which the juveniles were being chased. Of course, there is no quarantee any of the juveniles will stay, but in the meantime we are on 'stand by' to rescue any of them if they really do get into trouble. And for a local authority official to say to us 'they look happy' is just plain silly, anthropomorphological nonsense.



LLANSANTFFRAED AND THE NARES FAMILY

(Part 5)

We will now continue discussing the Naval career of George Strong Nares, following his progress after his 1869 transit of the Suez Canal, which so upset the French nation.

As previously related he was promoted to Captain in December 1869, then commanding *HMS Shearwater* (1871 – 1872) he continued hydrographical work. This included an oceanographic research of the sea currents around Gibraltar. This experience lead to him being next appointed to *HMS* **Challenger**, a steam assisted 2,306 ton corvette, which was sent on a three year voyage circumnavigating the world carrying out oceanographic exploration.

This voyage was the first time that the world's oceans were systematically investigated for scientific purposes. The crew included a team of civilian scientists as well as officers experienced as naval surveyors. Challenger spent the first year in the Atlantic, then in 1874, travelling between Cape Town and Australia, she investigated in a southerly direction visiting Marion, Kerguelon and the Heard islands. She next ventured south as far as 66° 40' S, 78° 22'E, where ice prevented further progress. Challenger became the first steampropelled vessel to cross the Antarctic Circle.

On this voyage Nares took his nine year old son, William Grant Nares with him, accompanied by a tutor, Adam Ebbels, who unfortunately died later in the voyage. Another unique feature of the expedition was the innovative extensive use of photography as a means of recording records, which ensured it a place in history. Nares published a two volume book in 1878, entitled 'Voyage to the Polar Sea', which is now highly valued for its early photographs.

In 1874, Nares was recalled and appointed to command the *Alert* and *Discovery* vessels during the British Arctic Expedition. He was an ideal choice for this because of his past experience in both Arctic and Antarctic expeditions. He was then in the prime of his life and one of the most experienced surveyors existing at that time. The ships attempted to reach the North Pole by sailing into the Arctic

Ocean, via Smith Sound, which separated Greenland from Ellesmere Island. This attempt failed and the *Alert* only managed to reach Floeberg Beach at 82° N, on the north-east tip of Ellesmere Island, one of the highest Northern Latitudes reached at that date.



This voyage lasted 18 months but was blighted by an outbreak of the highly dreaded disease – scurvy. This outbreak, particularly amongst sledging parties, became so severe that it was decided to make an early return in autumn 1876. This decision probably saved many lives amongst those affected. Nares was severely criticised for



allowing scurvy to develop, he pointed out that he had regularly issued rations of lime juice the recognised preventive. It was later discovered that it had been boiled before being bottled to enhance the storage. The boiling caused the loss of much of the vitamin 'C' content, making it practically useless.

Nares was made a Fellow of the Royal Society in 1875 and in 1877 awarded the gold medal of the Royal Geographic Society and also the Societe de Géographic de Paris. In 1876 he was knighted by Her Majesty Queen Victoria, then in 1878 he was appointed again to the Alert to carry out further surveying work in the Magellan Straight. After one season, he was recalled and appointed Marine Adviser to the Board of Trade. He served in the Harbour Department from 1879 to 1896. He was a Conservator of the River Mersey

from 1896 to 1910. He officially retired from active Naval service in 1886.

Nares was made a Rear Admiral in 1887 and placed on the retired list of Vice Admirals in 1892. One point of interest is that Nares was a member of the 'Ship Committee' for Captain Scott's ill-fated Antarctic expedition. Nares died in 1915 and his wife, Mary Grant, in 1905. He was buried at Long Ditton Churchyard on the 19th January 1915. Two of his sons also entered the Royal Navy and one of them, Vice Admiral John Dodd Nares (1877 to 1957), became Assistant Hydrographer and Director of the International Hydrographic Bureau at Monaco. Nares certainly left his mark on the world's geography because his name was so frequently used in naming many of the regions that he encountered. Examples of this are Nares Harbour in the

Admiralty Islands, Nares Deep in the North Atlantic, two Capes in the Canadian Arctic, Nares Land in northern Greenland, Nares Straight between Ellesmere Island and Greenland and Mount Nares in Victoria Land in the Antarctic. etc. etc.. (The End)


