Luftwaffe Drop Bombs and Leaflets on Rogerstone

'Hitler's Last Appeal to Reason'

During two Luftwaffe bombing raids over South Wales on the evening of Saturday, 3rd August 1940, one stray aircraft dropped a quantity of propaganda leaflets over Rogerstone: the leaflets were printed English copies of a speech given by Adolf Hitler before members of the Reichstag, Berlin, on 19th July 1940.

An Early Warning

There were two early siren warnings during the late hours of that Saturday evening, the second warning lasting about three-quarters of an hour. In due course the sound of high flying aircraft could be heard overhead and the pilots received a 'warm' reception for the night sky above Rogerstone was soon lit by the flashes of anti-aircraft guns and searchlights.

As the bombing raid abated, Rogerstone residents once again heard a warning siren and again fearing another air-raid that night sort safe shelter. A stray aircraft was seen flying overhead and the residents later reported to the authorities of seeina 'bombs' droppina but hearing no explosions! The following morning local police and air-raid wardens. while investigating possible damage to local properties, discovered propaganda leaflets littered about the district. One leaflet was caught in a tree branch and the Argus reported: 'there was competition for this copy'.



A Last Appeal

The leaflets dropped and collected were each of four pages measuring 12 inches by 18 inches. The cover page was headlined: 'A Last Appeal to Reason by Adolph Hitler: - A Speech before the Reichstag, 19th July, 1940.'

One bale of leaflets had failed to open and nearby there were slats of wood held by strands of wire used to hold the bundle of leaflets together. In another local district, leaflets were scattered in fields and hedgerows while in Exeter a quantity of leaflets fell on a sewage farm.

A railway employee, working a night-shift at the marshalling yards close to Rogerstone's aluminium works, recalls a bale of leaflets crashing onto the roof of a 'gangers' shed located near the rail-sidings. The bale of propaganda leaflets landed heavily, crashing through the tin roof and rebounding off the shoulder of a workmate who was sheltering in the shed. It

was recorded that the 'ganger' suffered from mild shock and bruising but soon recovered to continue his duties. Local police and military personnel hurriedly scoured the district in an attempt to collect and destroy the leaflets before they were read by the local populace. Quick-action by Rogerstone's residents and railway-yard workers had hurriedly spent Sunday morning souvenir-hunting by climbing trees and walking the hedgerows in order to add the collected leaflets to their wartime scrapbooks.

For the Benefit of War Charities

Some days later the South Wales Argus reported two postmen had also collected propaganda leaflets only to advertise and sell the leaflets to souvenir hunters. The twenty-five shillings proceeds were donated to the British War Charity!

Not to be outdone, leaflets dropped over Rogerstone were collected by residents and later sold by Lady Seager from a stall on the roadside outside her home at Castleton. It was reported that a considerable sum of money was raised to support the Newport and Cardiff Spitfire Fund.

A leaflet dropped on Rogerstone during the night of 3rd August, 1940, can be viewed in the War Room entrance at Risca Museum which is open every Saturday from 10am to 12.30pm.


Reservoirs in Wales

The Garreg Ddu Dam

Although looking like a viaduct, it is actually a submerged dam. Its role is to maintain a sufficient level in the Garreg-ddu reservoir so water can enter the Foel Tower and the gravity-driven aqueduct to the Frankley Reservoir in Birmingham. The dam is only required to operate during times of extreme drought.

The water flows to the Severn Trent water treatment works, where it is cleaned by rapid gravity filter sand beds. Chlorine, fluoride and lime are added. The Foel Tower stands 52m above the Frankley Reservoir in Birmingham. The gradient of the aqueduct which links them averages 1 in 2,300.

which allows the water to flow by gravity alone.

It also supports masonry pillars carrying the access roadway to the neighbouring valley of the River Claerwen which were clearly visible on our trip in September 2010 but when we visited the dam in February of 2014 it was full. Well worth and trip and only 1 ½ hours from Newport.



Tramroad - Sirhowy to Newport

Some readers may recall passenger trains passing through Risca, Rogerstone and Bassaleg pulled by locomotives bearing the initials L.M.S. (London, Midland and Scottish Railway). They carried passengers between the Sirhowy Valley and Newport until the late 1940s. From Nine Mile Point (near Wattsville) the trains ran over track of the Great Western Railway to gain access to Newport, Nicknamed 'The Cockney' it ran non-stop from Risca to Newport.

The right for the L.M.S. to 'invade' G.W.R, territory goes back to the start of the 19th century when the Tredegar Iron Company, having built a tramway down the Sirhowy Valley, made an agreement with The Monmouthshire Canal and Railway Company for through running to gain access to the wharves on the River Usk at Newport. The two tramways were ioined 'end to end' at Nine Mile Point, near Wattsville. Tramroads preceded railways and were local enterprises. These tramroads had cast iron 'L' shaped rails and the wagon wheels did not have flanges. Wagons and later carriages were drawn by horses but steam locomotives were beginning to appear in other parts of the Britain. The Tredegar Iron Company began hauling wagons of iron to Newport in 1805 but over 20 years later and having been aware of the success of steam haulage in other parts of the country, the Company decided on a change. The following appeared in the



on Monmouthshire lines and it may be said, its first appearance on any part of what is now the Great Western Railway. This engine was introduced by Samuel



Homfray of Tredegar Iron Works. He was the son of a father of the same name to whose wager with Richard Crawshay of Cyfarthfa Iron Works; the world is indebted for the contest that brought Trevithick's locomotive to notice. Mr. Homfrav purchased an engine from Mr R. Stephenson and Co. (Newcastle - upon - Tyne) which started running from Tredegar Iron Works in 1829 but it was not until the December that it travelled the Sirhowy and Monmouthshire Tramroads into Newport, a distance of 28 miles.' The inaugural run was not without

'The day previously, my father sent two men down from

incident as a letter to the Evening

Tredegar, one with a hatchet and a saw; the other with a ladder and a gauge. They had instructions 'to cut all branches of' (along the track from Tredegar to Newport). The men got as far as Bassaleg (just two miles from destination) and 'went on the spree' at a local pub. When Stephenson's Flyer came, the drivers thought the men had cleared the way through to Newport but a low branch in Tredegar Park, Bassaleg, was hit which knocked the chimney off the locomotive.'

Thomas Ellis is part of the story of Tredegar Ironworks, a name borne by father, son and grandson. The oldest Thomas Ellis was instrumental with Samuel Homfray in bringing three of Stephenson's locomotives to the ironworks and tramroads. Later his son supervised the construction of a further nine locomotives for the ironworks and the tramroad.

The middle of the 19th century brought the conversion of the tramroads into railways. Then followed purchase of the Sirhowy line by the L.N.W.R. (later forming part of the L.M.S.) and the line through Risca, Rogerstone and Bassaleg by the G.W.R.



And Now for Something Completely Different....

As I'm sure you appreciate 'it' almost always starts with a telephone call; 'Is that Swan Rescue?', to which the answer is, of course, 'Yes'. Usually, what follows is perfectly straightforward; help is needed for a swan, a goose, a duck, or at this time of year, a multitude of ducklings. Occasionally the question asked is surprising; 'will you help - my dog (or cat) needs rescuing. This one is followed by a pause for breath and then the statement 'we're very sorry, but the clue is in the name SWAN RESCUE, which tends to bring the conversation to an abrupt end! On this occasion, second half of April, it really was completely different, a first; an Osprey. The caller is an employee of Welsh Water based at the string of reservoirs to the west of the A470 between Merthyr Tydfil and Brecon. It was reported to be unable to fly, but instead was fluttering helplessly behind the dam wall of the middle reservoir.

Because of other commitments it was left to the locals to catch the casualty, which they were able to do quite easily. We then met their driver at Pwll-y-Pant to the north of Caerphilly, and from there to

the only organisation capable of carrying out the necessary assessment and follow-up treatment, the International Centre for Birds of Prey (ICBP) at Newent in Gloucestershire (very well worth a visit).

The initial assessment was mildly encouraging, a few primary feathers damaged and some strain to the wing, but no broken bones. This was confirmed the following day on a visit to a world renowned bird of prey vet at Swindon. Once back at Newent, work was started on repairing all but one of the damaged flight

feathers. This involved cutting them and inserting into the shaft and gluing in place bamboo slivers, obviously very carefully aligned and waiting for the repair to set.

The next development was a phone call just five days after the rescue to announce the bird really was raring to go, simply astonishing. As with the rescue itself, it was disappointing not to have been part of it, so with the release, but for obvious good reasons it was right and proper that ICBP staff should take control of this. The release went very well, actually on the sixth day. Those who work on the reservoirs report the bird stayed around for most of the rest of the day, but there was no sign of him the following day. This bird was ringed, so we know

a bit more about him. He was ringed as a nestling on 2nd July 2014 on The Black Isle, Inverness. This species migrates for the winter to The Gambia, West Africa, and so must have been returning to the breeding grounds when some accident befell him. It is so gratifying to have been involved, and to have the hope we may have contributed to securing a long and healthy life.


Waterfalls in Wales





There had been several occasions when wine glasses at the end of the bar had tumbled to the floor without being touched. More disturbingly, a member of staff staying alone in one of the bedrooms was suddenly awoken as if a bucket of water had been thrown over her. Her night attire, including the dressing gown she slept in, was drenched and yet the rest of the room was entirely dry. No plumbing defect or other cause was ever identified.

My friend countered with a story of his own, which concerned an acquaintance of his who had been a trainee nurse. She was covering the night shift in a hospital ward when she became aware of another nurse dressed in an old fashioned uniform walking through the corridor. The trainee thought it peculiar but took no

On another occasion. two men watched in horror as a newly hung portrait swung violently from side to side as if moved by an invisible force. Even the Principal was certain Bertha had returned from the grave when she appeared in his office shortly after her funeral. Fortunately, on this occasion, it was just Bertha's twin sister paving him a visit. If only all ghost stories could be explained so easily.

gathers for public worship on Sunday at the **Malpas Community Centre**, Pillmawr Road, at **3 pm**. Sermon excerpt from: A KINGDOM WHICH CANNOT BE MOVED

In light of the recent earthquakes in the Philippines and the continuing aftershocks, as well as the terrorist attacks in New Zealand and Sri Lanka, our text today should be a great encouragement to those of us who are trusting in our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. And let us continue to pray that God would turn the tragedy there into a triumph by shaking the affections of people loose from the world and putting those affections on the kingdom of God. So, let's pray together.

What is it that God is saying to us in such an earthquake as this in the Philippines? To find out, we turn to the Holy Bible. God's written Word is given to help us interpret His voice in nature - whether it is the voice in the wind and rain and floodwaters of Cyclone Idai, or in airplane crashes, or in auto accidents, or in the voice of the earth in the Philippines. Holy Scripture is not silent about earthquakes. And when earthquakes awaken the attention of the world, we need to go back and remember what they mean.

There are four points that I consider helpful.

First, God has appointed a great earthquake to bring this world to a close - a great final shaking of the earth and the heavens someday that will end this fallen creation as we know it and usher in eternity.

Second, long before that great shaking comes - even before the Tribulation - God has also appointed that there'll be an increasing frequency and intensity of earthquakes and other calamities.

Third, God in His great mercy is offering to everyone who trusts in His Son a kingdom that cannot be moved and will never end.

Fourth, therefore, let's worship and serve God with reverence and godly fear, because our **God is a consuming fire**.

So, let's take these one at a time and I'll try to unfold them from our text and elsewhere in Scripture and, hopefully, plant your feet upon a Rock for your own encouragement and for your free and willing service for Jesus Christ. I invite every believer to pray that there would be an irresistible attraction to the gospel of Jesus Christ in these days so that more people here in Wales and around the world in places like the Philippines and New Zealand and Sri Lanka and Mozambique would pass from spiritual death to spiritual life, because the shaking will increase as the coming of Christ approaches. And I cannot help but think that everybody would want a place to stand and that everybody would see the reasonableness that Almighty God - redeeming people through His Son - is the safest place in all the world to stand.

God has appointed <u>a great final shaking</u> of the earth that will mean the end of the world as we know it and the beginning of something infinitely better - the consummation of His kingdom.

Look first at verses 26 and 27 of our text:whose voice then shook the earth (referring to the shaking at Mount Sinai when He came to give the law, Exodus 19:18): but now he hath promised (an allusion to Haggai 2:6), saying, YET ONCE MORE I SHAKE NOT THE EARTH ONLY, BUT ALSO HEAVEN. (And then comes the interpretation of this prophecy.) And this *word*, Yet once more, signifieth the removing of those things that are shaken, as of things that are made, that those things which cannot be shaken may remain.

Now then, what you have here is a biblical prophecy that there's coming a day in which there'll be such a violent shaking in creation that the world as we know it will be removed. It simply will not be anymore. Finally, there'll come a new heaven and a new earth on which righteousness dwells, but this world is going to come to a cataclysmic end someday, and there'll be a removal of the world as

we know it, and what cannot be shaken will remain - the kingdom of God and everyone who dwells in it.

There are other places in the Bible where this is made clear. For example, take Isaiah 13:13, "I will shake the heavens, and the earth shall remove out of her place, in the wrath of the LORD of hosts, and in the day of his fierce anger."

So, there's coming a day of fierce anger and retribution and justice upon the earth for its sin, and the earth will be shaken out of its place.

Yes, it is a painful admission for a Texan, but I was born in California (or Caal - ee - for - nee - uh as Arnold Schwarzenegger pronounces it). If you spend much time around Californians, you find that they like to joke about "the big one" that's coming someday. Yes, there is "a big one" coming someday. It is going to be bigger than anyone can imagine. Christian friends, the desire of our heart ought to be that flippant Californians, Filipinos, and everybody else would realize just how big "the big one" that's coming is really going to be! It is so ginormously bigger than anybody realizes! Our imaginations cannot conceive of what it'll be like when the stars are falling, the skies are rolled up like a scroll, and the earth comes out of its foundations and collapses, and all the islands and the mountains vanish, and there is only God with whom we must deal. Listen to me now - if you feel secure and safe outside of Jesus Christ, I pray that you'd tremble at this thought, because you're most definitely going to face God someday with nothing to stand on but what was in your heart when the great quake came!

But long before this end comes, God has appointed that this great final shaking will be preceded by smaller earthquakes and other calamities of increasing frequency and intensity to give notice of something awesome, the way contractions and labour pains precede the birth of a child and tell us that it is coming.

This particular point is not found in our text from Hebrews. It is found in the words of Jesus to His disciples in Matthew 24:6-8. The disciples ask Jesus in verse 3 what will be the sign of His coming and the end of the world. He answers beginning in verse 6: "Ye shall hear of wars and rumours of wars: see that ye be not troubled: for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet. For nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom: and there shall be famines, and pestilences, and earthquakes, in divers places. All these are the beginning of sorrows." The word "sorrows" there is the Greek word $\omega\delta$ iv (odin) for "birth-pangs". Notice three things: first, there's an end coming ("the end is not yet"); second, before it comes there'll be wars, famines, and earthquakes; and third, these calamities before the end are called "sorrows" or "birth-pangs".

Calling the wars and famines and earthquakes "birth-pangs" is important for two reasons. First, it means that there'll be an increasing frequency of these things as the end comes near and that the intensity of them will increase, because that's the way it happens with labour pains before the birth of a child. Second, it means that what these earthquakes are leading up to is something wonderful, like the birth of a child. The labour may be painful, but it is full of hope. They're the birthpangs of a kingdom. That's what the meaning of increasing frequency of calamities will be as this age draws to a close.

We should, then, hear in every rumour of war and every famine and every earthquake, first of all, the voice of the Lord saying, "I reign! And I am a God of holiness and justice and wrath and I will not condone sin." We should also hear in this great shaking, "I am a God of mercy, a God of hope; I am bringing in the kingdom; I don't want it to happen suddenly without warning, so I have warned again and again and again with shakings that should have broken you loose from your love of the world." That's what the real meaning of this earthquake is. Believe in God. Put your trust in Him...

THE FINAL FATE OF H.M.S. NEWPORT

(Part 2)

After the three reluctant members left the party and returned to the ship, Albanov and the remaining men continued on through the ever-shifting ice. Albanov already had strong doubts about the general health and stamina of the party. They still showed signs of the scurvy that had afflicted the whole crew during the past year, due to the lack of antiscorbutics in their diet. One man was 56 years old and staggering; another man had a hernia; another man had been complaining about chest pains for some time; another man had open sores on his legs; all of them complained of sore feet and had asthma symptoms.

Albanov had calculated that Franz Joseph Land most likely lay to the east of his little party, fortunately he was eventually proved to be correct. His means of navigation were minimal and included no way to calculate longitude. The only map that he carried was a sketch made of a page from Fridtjof Nansen's book Farthest North, published 20 years earlier. This showed Franz Joseph Land indicated by hypothetical dotted lines.

Albanov kept a diary in which he recorded details of their 90 day journey, which was to cover the 235 miles travelled from the trapped Saint Anna to Cape Flora. His terse narrative described how the party faced dangers from constantly shifting ice, disintegrating ice floes, blizzards, snow-blindness, attacks by polar bears and walrus. Albanov had to persuade his men to





cumbersome and heavy sledges carrying their kayaks and supplies. The kayaks were often required to enable them to transit the frequent stretches of open water. The party managed to shoot some of the polar bears and walrus, which then provided them with additional food supplies.

On June 5th they caught a glimpse of distant land some way ahead, but members of the party were becoming apathetic, dragging their feet and not attempting to stride

purposely forward. One night two of the men chose to sneak away, purloining part of the parties' equipment and supplies. Albanov was disgusted by the betrayal and would have dealt harshly and swiftly with the mutineers, but realised that it would be pointless to attempt to chase after them to retrieve the stolen goods. On June the 9th, a short distance from land, an ice storm suddenly erupted and blew the ice floes apart, scattering the remaining members of the party. Albanov described how after being stuck on small battered pieces of ice they had to clamber into the unstable kayaks and try to avoid damaging them on the sharp edges of the shattered drifting ice. Miraculously all the men were re-united and managed to scramble up on to a glacier with their sledges and kayaks and then continued to stumble onwards. The storm raged around the glacier, which rose twelve feet above water level, the waves making it impossible to continue the crossing. Finally the storm abated, but three of the remaining members of the party had been swept away, leaving just Albanov and Konrad still surviving on the battered glacier. The Kayak belonging to this

fortunate pair slipped and slid down from the top of the glacier to land, undamaged, in the water. They quickly gathered together their remaining belongings, dismantled the sledge and loaded everything into the kayak. Then paddling, with desperation for six hours, eventually reached Bell Island. As soon as they landed on a solid shore they ran about furiously to restore the circulation in their stiffly frozen legs.

The next morning, after managing to shoot a few ducks for food, the pair set off for Cape Flora on Northbrook Island. Finally, after much paddling they landed on this Cape, where totally exhausted they lay down on the ground to rest and recover their strength. They eventually rose to their feet and began to explore and came upon the remains of a wooden hutted camp built several years earlier by an explorer named Frederick George Jackson, leader of the Jackson-Harmsworth expedition in 1896. This camp had also been used, in 1902-1905, by an American William Ziegler who stopped here when making unsuccessful attempts to reach the North Pole. Albanov and Konrad were delighted to find that Ziegler had

fortunately left ample supplies of still edible food. The food supplies contained intact sealed cans of pemmican, beef, mutton, dried vegetables, cakes of chocolate, powdered eggs etc. There was also chests of ship's biscuits and supplies of tea and coffee. Many other useful things were to be found even including a rifle and ammunition. The food supplies were sufficient to sustain them for several months. The pair discovered documents in one of the huts that indicated that a Russian explorer named Georgy Yakovlevich Sedov had, when on a polar expedition, called at the Jackson Camp. The pair initially thought that a ship would come from Archangel to contact Sedov and provide them with a means of rescue. However, one day a ship suddenly came into sight which they recognised as the Svyatoy Muchenik Foka (Saint Martyr Foka), which they had previously seen at Archangel being fitted out for Sedov. He had died of scurvy at sea and the ship was now returning to Archangel after calling at Cape Flora to search for fuel. The surviving pair were finally rescued!!!
