Rogerstone Welfare Cricket Returns

Following a long but very necessary period without cricket because of Covid-19 Cricket returned to The Welfare Grounds on Saturday 25th July.

Before this only outdoor net practice was allowed between two families or less with only one net being used and with social distancing and hand sanitising. It has not been an easy task to get cricket back. Consent had to be obtained from The Senedd. the governing body ECB/Cricket Wales and finally Rogerstone Community Council. To get this approval very stringent safety precautions have had to be put in place in line with the quidelines. This includes a very comprehensive Risk Assessment covering many areas. Firstly, everyone who plays or officiates or who enters the pavilion or patio area has to sign

the attendance sheet and leave

contact details. These will be

discarded after 21 days.
Use of the nets is via a booking system with available slots displayed and names of people booked in. 10 minutes is allowed for safe changeover.

Included is a one-way system into and out of the pavilion for toilet use with a hand sanitizing station on entry and exit which is via the back door. Also, the patio area, mainly for spectator guests, has a one-way system and hand sanitizer station. 2 metre social distancing measures are in place together with many other safety rules notices.

The scorers are positioned on the open air balcony with social distancing and hand sanitising. Players are only allowed into the pavilion to use the downstairs toilet facilities. There are no showers, changing rooms or upstairs toilets in use. There are no teas as in a normal match. Players are asked to provide their own food or grab something to eat from The Hut Cafe. Both teams will come ready dressed.

Copious amounts of hand sanitizer and PPE have been provided by the ECB via the NAT WEST CRICKET FORCE scheme for which we are indebted.

On the field of play the umpires are not allowed to touch the ball or take care of any fielder's cap or sweater. All players must hand sanitise every six overs and when fielding the fielder must return the ball directly to the bowler. On the boundary we





have added signs to the boundary markers warning spectators not to touch the ball and to keep 2 metres from the boundary. This has been helped by the Council staff ensuring that the boundary is marked a good 2 metres from the park benches. Batsmen have extra wide social distancing markers to ensure social distance from umpires when running.

With respect to refreshment drinks, these are served from the kitchen window to customers who are socially distanced

outside on the patio. Drinks are only served in disposable containers.

We would like to thank Cricket Wales for all their work behind the scenes supporting the club and many others and their negotiations with The Senedd. We would also like to thank the Community Council for their understanding and specifically Steve Davies and his ground staff for their continued support. Lastly, we would like to thank our Covid-19 Safeguarding Champion Jon Matthews and his team for the hard work put in to make our club safe. After all this hard work and waiting it is refreshing that we have the game up and running

levels. Unfortunately, because of the timing and the Covid-19 outbreak we have had to cancel our All Stars program. It is also very pleasing that after a long break, players are very enthusiastic and membership levels have soared to new levels.



Lockdown bightig littering illiteracy

When I started to consider my theme for this month's topic I had just come in from our monthly litter pick on Twmbarlwm. I thought I can't go banging on about rubbish and littering on our mountain again – can I? But then I realised that I haven't written about this disgusting habit for quite a while so I'm afraid the answer is a resounding "Yes" – indeed I really need to highlight this problem.

As part of the coronavirus restrictions the government allowed and encouraged people to maintain their fitness with at least a daily walk. So more people than ever seemed to be getting up to Twmbarlwm for their daily fitness routine. That's great but I was amazed that so many people seem to think it's okay to casually leave their empty bottles and energy-bar wrappers scattered about the countryside. I often gather a bag of such rubbish on my walks around the mountainside.


The nature of this litter suggests to me it's dumped by people who are out exercising – runners, cyclists etc. – surely if you take that stuff up the mountain with you, it's not too much effort to bring the empties back down with you?

Those of you who are briefly passing through our landscape scattering your dross to the four winds should go back to class to revise the country code and learn to leave only footprints – and make sure your friends get the message too.

Another bone of contention during lockdown was the fact that the council had closed down most civic waste disposal facilities. Many people argue that this policy led to an increase in fly-tipping in many areas around the borough. I'm not going to speculate on the veracity of that argument because in my opinion there can be no excuse for the crime of fly-tipping.

To load a car or van with household detritus and drive miles out into the countryside with the intention of dumping it in a hedgerow or on a quiet mountainside is an act so premeditated and anti-

To teach such perpetrators the error of their ways we should all be more vigilant and report any incidents of fly-tipping. If you see it in progress or have proof of the culprits, you can report it to the police using their 101 service, you can do so anonymously if you don't want to get involved.

Don't forget, if you arrange to have rubbish collected professionally, it is your responsibility to ensure it is a properly licensed service – if a fly-tip is traced back to you, you are liable to be prosecuted and fined as much as the offender. I can assure

you that the authorities do try to trace the origin of the offenders and successful prosecutions are on the rise.

CTS did not arrange any "official" litter picks during the lockdown period but I am very grateful to a few members who went and did a clean-up on the mountain of their

At the end of July we had our first litter-pick since January. Nearly a dozen willing volunteers turned up and we collected twenty bags of rubbish and cleaned up a couple of burnt out mattresses. The following day, CCBC collected what we had gathered. We are always grateful when the council supports us so well in our efforts to keep our mountain and environs tidy for everyone to enjoy.

Maybe the most challenging lesson needs to go out to that group of young people who gather, like teenagers have always done, to have a bit of fun and have a sneaky drink or whatever. I know you don't think it's cool, but go on, take your fast food wrappers and unmentionable trash home with you – and behave like the little angels all your parents think you are.

I dare you, get "Keep Wales Tidy" trending – or better still, join us for a litter-pick.

Changes to Welsh Land Transaction Tax

The Welsh Government announced that the Land Transaction Tax (LTT) would change, bringing the rate payable for properties valued at between £180,000 and £250,000 to zero. The changes will come into play on 27 July 2020 and will run up until 31 March 2021.

Properties in Wales selling for under £180,000 were already exempt of paying the tax, so essentially the Government has extended the threshold up to £250,000. The change will not include second homes or buy-to-let properties, which will continue to pay the existing LTT as well as 3% of additional tax.

The First Prize of War

As countries across the world implement lockdown strategies to stem the tide of the coronavirus, many people have taken the opportunity to reconnect with family and acquaintances. I am no exception and have been exchanging stories (and cute animal videos) with an old friend from Hamburg.

Curiously, there is one major tale from history that links our two cities, that of the SS Belgia.

The steamship was originally called the Irak and was constructed in Belfast in 1901. It operated out of Liverpool for over decade until it was acquired by the Hamburg America Line in 1913, when it was renamed the Belaia. In August the following year, the vessel was travelling from Boston, Massachusetts to Hamburg with a cargo that included flour, timber, and copper as well as animals bound for Hamburg Zoo. These consisted of various exotic birds, chameleons, bullfrogs, rattlesnakes, racoons, and even two live alligators. On 3 August, the Captain learnt that war had broken out between France and Germany and he was reportedly concerned that his ship might be captured by the French Navy as it passed through the English Channel. Claiming that its reserves of coal were running low, the Belgia headed towards the Bristol Channel but was refused entry to both Barry Dock and Cardiff Pier Head. As it approached Newport, the last of the Welsh seaports, it was instructed to set anchor and wait for a pilot to navigate the ship into the newly opened Alexandra Dock.

Some five hours later, however,

events had caught up with the ship as Britain and Germany declared war. In less than two hours, the Chief Constable and the Dockmaster took a tuqboat

called Wolfhound and concealed a team of twelve policemen below deck. The men were armed with rifles borrowed from the Territorial Army, although these were reputedly devoid of ammunition. The Belgia was then berthed successfully with the Captain's cooperation, whereupon the policemen emerged from their hiding place and captured the liner along with its 20 crew, 75 reservists, and floating menagerie. The Germans, who offered no resistance, are thought to have become the first prisoners of the entire conflict. They were taken to the Temperance Hall in Dock Street before being transported to the Isle of Man, where they were interned for the duration of the war. Meanwhile, the ship's cargo was sold in auction at the Waterloo Hotel and the alligators and reptiles are said to have been displayed at Abergavenny Fair. The incident made the global news. including an announcement in the New York Times.

The Hamburg America Line protested at the loss of the *Belgia*, arguing that it

breached the Hague Convention that protected ships against seizure if moored at an enemy port during the outbreak of war. However, a British Court ruled that the vessel was not docked at Newport when hostilities were declared and as such, the confiscation was lawful.

As a prize of war, the Belgia soon found itself swelling the ranks of the Merchant Navv under the new moniker. Huntstrick. At the time, it was customary to rechristen seized ships with names that bore the anti-German prefix. Hun-. In June 1917, the steamer was tasked with delivering troops and provisions to Salonika in Greece but it was sunk by U-39. captained by Walter Forstmann, one of Germany's foremost Uboat commanders. Fifteen lives were claimed in the attack off the coast of Morocco, including Huntstrick's Master, Robert Duncanson, Ironically, he lived in Clyffard Crescent, just a short walk from where his ship had been captured in Newport less than three years before.



THE MYSTERY OF THE MEMORIAL PLAQUE DISCOVERED IN RHIWDERIN

(PART 2)

I will open this part of the article with a photograph of Eveswell Street as it was before W.W. 2. It is likely that many of the people standing pictured in the group may have died during the bombing incident, perhaps even Albert Garland was amongst this group.

The Memorial Plaque for A. Garland is engraved from Fellow Workers Npt. Corporation, Red & White Services, Barlows Furnishers, Richards

Caterers, & Friends Rodney Road. We can presume that all the people mentioned in the plaque must have worked with and known Albert

Garland. They possibly collected money and contributed to and paid for the Memorial Plaque. The first question is – Where was it intended to be attached by means of the four corner holes? Suggestions that have been made to me include that the plaque could possibly be screwed to a coffin containing the unidentified remains of the bomb victims, or secured to a wall in Albert's local school or church.

The second question has to be why was it that the Plaque ended up in this cottage garage in Rhiwderin? Maybe a previous owner of the cottage was a relative or friend or fellow worker of Albert Garland and for some particular reason had retained possession of the Plaque.

An informative local history book The History of Newport Borough by Hadyn Davis mentions that Albert



Coincidently, another bomb victim, Mr. Alfred Searle of Gaerwood House, is also mentioned in the same book, as the founder and


commanding officer of the same unit for 41 years. Perhaps the plaque could have been intended to be mounted and displayed on the wall of the Sea Cadet's headquarters? Then for

some reason this did not happen and one of the people involved retained it and took it to Rhiwderin, where it remained.

There are also similar sized memorial plaques mounted in St. John's Parish Church, Maindee. This may have been Albert Garland's local place of worship.

I have attempted to contact the Sea Cadets to see if they held any information about their former Bandmaster Albert Garland, leaving messages on their answer phone and sending them emails. The only response was an acknowledgement of my emails saying that they would get back in touch later, but I have not had any further message.

As a matter of interest I have discovered that Sea Cadets Corps was developed locally from the Maindee Church Lad's Naval Brigade. I also searched in a recent telephone directory for local residents with a Garland surname, to see if any of them were related to the Maindee Garland family. I did speak to about six local residents named Garland including one with a Conway Road address (situated close to Eveswell Street), but none were related to the Eveswell Street Garlands.



I have also arranged with contacts in the Newport Reference Library to try and identify the names of people living at Deri Cottage, Caerphilly Close, Rhiwderin during the relevant period. I was hoping to discover a possible connection to the Maindee Garland family. Unfortunately, none of my attempts to discover any further information about the plaque or Mr. Garland have been successful. Basically there are two unanswered questions, where was this plaque intended to be mounted on display? And why did it end up in Rhiwderin? I have, therefore, decided to conclude my investigations and throw the search open to the readers of this Directory. I request that anyone, with any suggestions to contact the editors of the Directory with any relevant information or suggestions.

New normal / new you!

So here we are, finding ourselves saying 'the new normal'. Who would have thought it, still stuck in a routine or no routine, kids back to school or not back to school, back to work or staying at home. How do we get back on track

to look after ourselves? As a health professional it has been challenging to motivate clients to look after themselves, our own health is the first thing to suffer if stress levels are high and routines are changeable. Excuses creep in and exercise and good nutrition takes a back seat. Where do you gain focus from and what simple steps can you take, to start prioritising YOU? There was one thing people fell in love with during the pandemic, this was aettina outdoors and walking, cycling or jogging. This became a priority for most to gain some control back. So why let the 'new norm' stop this healthy habit? Did you know when trying to lose weight

and shift stubborn body fat, by increasing your daily exercise-related activity thermogenesis (EAT) contributes up to 30% of your daily calorie expenditure and yet your gym or class session only contributes to 10%. So, yes getting your 10,000 steps in a day holds greater value for you on your journey than you ever thought, when trying to lose weight.

The other great shift, was having time to cook. Whilst some decisions were questionable, people fell in love with cooking again. Did you know by tracking calories through free apps. like Myfitnesspal, leads to a more mindful approach to how you fuel your body? Enabling you to make better food choices, better education and relationships around good nutrition. Government guidelines suggest 2500kcals a day for men and 2000kcals for women, when actually if we move very little this could be adjusted by about 500 kcals per gender, allowing only 2000kcals for men and 1500kcals for women. Once you start tracking you become so much more aware of the calorie total and how making healthier swaps leads to a better fuelled body and overall weight loss.

Clients I have helped to take back control, track calories to start their journey, becoming more aware of their nutritional habits, achieve 10,000 steps a day, drink at least two litres of water a day and find ways to add vegetables to their diet. No juices, portion control fads, no limited macros, no fad diets. Just mindful eating, stepping and better food choices.

The one piece of advice I would give you, is try not to do it all at once... it takes 21 days to form a habit. Pick one and do it well, rather than five and do them mediocre. Be accountable, weight loss is a journey, not easy, not linear but one with highs and lows, that is evaluated regularly. If you would like advice on where to start please get in touch. The journey does not need to be hard and difficult, with support you just simply need to start.

What Did You Do in the Lock-down Daddy?

To coin a phrase! The simple honest answer is that we carried on pretty well as normal. Apart from April, which was eerily quiet and uneventful, we were on the road only ten times, calls for our services continued more or less unabated. It is worth noting swan rescue activity is very largely a solitary occupation so that social

distancing is really not a problem. The following statistics

(below table) comparing the period March to July (up to 27th for 2020), are presented in support of this statement.

The most striking feature of our journeys until just over a week ago is how little traffic there was and in particular how incredibly easy it was to exit High Cross onto the main road. But now it is at least as bad as ever and manners of some drivers appear to us to be plummeting to new lows.

As might be expected we have a

couple of rescues worthy of mention, but the two we will touch on both owe the eventual success to the sterling efforts of crews from the Fire and Rescue stations in Yate (South Gloucestershire) and Cwmbran. In the first case, our victim was a 'yearling' which had been driven away from his natal home by his parents, normal behaviour as the start of the next breeding season approaches and found himself

trapped in the deep narrow stream bed cut for the River Frome close to Yate town centre. Our picture shows the final act, made possible by the Fire Officer driving the swan towards me leading to capture and relocation to a sanctuary in the West Midlands.

The second required the help of a team of really fit guys to assist in the capture of the third (of seven) cygnets on the canal in Old Cwmbran, all of which had fallen victim to lost or carelessly discarded fishing tackle and all of which needed to be hospitalised. Our picture shows the final moments after the cygnet had been netted, just before taking charge of him for investigation, care and treatment.

Our involvement with 'tackled' swans continues unabated; sadly, nothing has changed in almost 40 years!

Sincere heartfelt thanks to Red/Green and White Watch respectively for making both these rescues possible in the most efficient and timely way possible.



V L Roberts of Rogerstone

The lock down and coronavirus restrictions in the spring of 2020 brought about many changes in lifestyles. As I could no longer travel in Britain and Europe, I resolved to walk five miles each day in and around Rogerstone. On one occasion driven by impulse and intuition, I took a detour through the churchyard of St John's in the centre of the village. For the first time. I noticed a Commonwealth War **Graves Commission (CWGC)** headstone from the Second World War, I noted the following key details: -

V L Roberts Volunteer 13th Gloucestershire Bn Home Guard, died 25th September 1940, Age 23. Beloved Husband of Elsie and Loving Son of William and Gertrude Roberts of Rogerstone.

The grave is in the north west corner of the churchyard in the shelter of trees close to the path, the entrance gate and the more recent memorial to all those who lost their lives through armed conflict.

My first clue came from Shaun McGuire's excellent website Newport's War Dead and from CWGC records. The 13th Gloucestershire Battalion was designated City of Bristol Home Guard, I deduced that Vivian Lawrence Roberts was based in Bristol in 1940 and would have probably ioined the Home Guard when it came into being in June of that year. The Commonwealth War Graves Commission confirmed that Volunteer was the correct designation as the Home Guard was formed without formal Army ranks. These in the

style of *Dad's Army* were not adopted until 1941.The Commission added that there are 395 such headstones in the United Kingdom.

At that point in my research I felt it unlikely that V L Roberts had died as a result of enemy action. As it turned out I could not have been more wrong. Firstly though, thanks to the help from family historian, David
Swidenbank I learnt more about

Vivian himself. He married Elsie Mary Cashmore in the spring of 1939; they were living at Elsian 694 Filton Avenue, Filton, Bristol; Vivian was employed as an Aircraft Tool room Miller, a reserved occupation, at the nearby Bristol Aeroplane Company. More dramatically, I found precise details of the time and manner of his death on Wednesday 25th September 1940. Jane Marley, Museums and Heritage Officer at South Gloucestershire Council helpfully sent me digital copies of newspaper cuttings and evewitness accounts of that fateful Wednesday afternoon.

The aircraft factory and aerodrome at Filton, a suburb of Bristol, became a major target for the Luftwaffe, Nazi Germany's Air Force, one day in 1940 when without warning some 80 German aircraft descended from a clear mid-day sky just as workers were departing for their lunch break. Although the raid only lasted for 45 seconds, substantial damage was caused to the Rodnev Road Works, the Flight Sheds and to eight precious production aircraft. In total, the raid claimed the lives of 132 people throughout the area including 92 'Bristol aircraft' workers. There can be no doubt that Vivian Lawrence became a casualty as the direct result of enemy action. He is commemorated on the war memorial inside St Peter's Church, Filton, His heroism and sacrifice deserve to be remembered in Rogerstone and Filton alike, especially by marking the 80th anniversary of his death on 25th September 2020.


